Otley Chamber of Trade is a nonpolitical, independent, not for profit body of volunteers that seeks to represent and assist the local business community and promote the town. This Bulletin is a monthly summary of local economic news relating to Otley and its business activity:-

Angels of Beauty –beautician has expanded onto the above floors at 6 Bondgate



ASDA/Sainsbury – as forecast in Bulletin 118 and noted in Bulletin 112, the proposed £12 billion merger between the two supermarket groups has been blocked by the Competition and Markets Authority whose report published at the end of April found that the merger would risk limiting consumer choice

What now for ASDA? Having been in the ownership of American giant Walmart since 1999 the Leeds headquartered supermarket, which started in 1949 as Associated Dairies, could either be re-listed to the London Stock Exchange, which it left in 1999 after the £6.7billion takeover by Walmart, or perhaps sold to a private equity investor or another retailer. ASDA had expressed an interest in household retailer B&M although a reverse takeover may now prove more likely. Watch this space...

Ashfield Works – the contentious planning application on the long derelict site, once used for manufacture of printing machinery for 'Demolition of derelict buildings, conversion of former industrial buildings to retail and office use, construction of care home, retail units, six residential units and new pay and display car park' has been approved by Leeds City Council. Within the scheme is a 66 bed care home and potentially a supermarket and other retail. No doubt the care home will find an operator but whether the rest of the scheme is viable remains to be seen. With consent granted, Leeds City council will be able to sell the site to their preferred developer, Norwood Homes

Black Bull – the planned renovation of the historic Market Place pub has now gone to planning. The applications are for 'internal alterations and external works including timber arched entrance to courtyard, with faux planter boxes, timber post with lighting and new bin store'. Bulletin took its cue from the Leeds Economy Bulletin, a quarterly glossy magazine published, no doubt at great cost, by Leeds City Council Economic Development Unit. It didn't ever seem to feature anything about Otley so we decided to do our own...

At that time in 2009 a note of caution was issued from within our Executive group, 'it's a big commitment so don't start it then just give up after a few months'. Ten years later, whatever the challenge, the Bulletin has been delivered in the first week of the month, every month, for free into the hand of pretty much every business in the town centre, emailed to countless others and made available on the Chamber's website to anyone who might be interested in the towns economic fortunes

Containing national, regional and above all local business news, it's also fair to say though that the hoped for contribution of stories from businesses around town hasn't been what it could be – Otley's shops, offices, pubs, cafes and manufacturers must be a bashful lot – which has made the challenge of filling the content by the monthly print deadline a bit of an undue pressure. Chevin Barber – the planning application to convert the barber and sunbed studio at 1 Mercury Row into a domestic dwelling has been refused consent by Leeds City Council

Courtyard Planters - the Westgate oasis of all things gardening is going to trial a deposit return scheme for plastic plant pots, similar to the kind that used to exist for glass pop bottles. To earn 5p for each 1, 2 or 3 litre plant pot, take them along for reuse. These are the sizes the nursery uses in and the majority of their plants are sold in these sizes. It says on the bottom of each pot what size it is

For The Home - is ending their temporary occupation of the former Nat West bank on Manor



Square, used as storage whilst arranging their new giant retail warehouse operation in Pudsey. The former bank is now looking for a new occupier again

Household income – average pay in the 3 months to March showed a slight slowdown in annual wage growth, excluding bonuses, to 3.3%, compared to 3.4% in the three months to February

CPI inflation remained unchanged from February at 1.9% over the same period, showed a net average salary increase of 1.4%. Earnings have now outstripped inflation each month for over a year, albeit marginally

ex-Korks – the planning application for 'Listed Building application for demolition of extension to rear and construction of replacement two storey extension with internal alterations to existing building' has been withdrawn. The building remains for sale with Gargrave based Westlake & Co, offers around £400,000

Otley Carnival – expect a large crowd of people in town on Saturday 15th June for the annual Otley Carnival



parade. Part of Leeds Road, Gay Lane, Bondgate, Kirkgate and Bridge Street will be closed to traffic from about 1pm for around 20 minutes as the parade makes its way from eth auction market to the show ground, where festivities continue until about 5pm. Estate agent, Dacre Son & Hartley is the headline sponsor

Otley Cycle Races – love it or hate it the 34th annual Otley town centre cycle races evening takes place on Wednesday 3rd July 2019. Otley Chamber wishes the event well but has not organized the Friends of Otley Cycle Race patronage this year. Incidentally 2016 and 2017 winner, Chris Lawless recently won the Tour de Yorkshire race for Team Ineos. Expect Kirkgate, Bondgate, Burras Lane, Birdcage Walk and Gay Lane to close to traffic from about 5pm until the presentations are finished, around 10pm. For more see https://www.otleycycleraces.com/

Each entry will include your business name,



Santander – the Kirkgate branch has now closed. Not only has that diminished the choice of banking services but also cost the town another cash point facility. With Barclays, HSBC, Natwest, TSB and now Santander having removed their ATM services Otley Show day saw unprecedented long queues outside Halifax and Yorkshire Banks

Once a branch of Bradford & Bingley Building Society and before that an Abbey National, remember the days before 'carpet bagging'? The process of members forcing building societies to convert into banks for a short term shares windfall now doesn't seem to have been such a good idea

Unemployment – nationally another large decrease, this time by 65,000 to 1.3million for the three months to March, a new 44 year low of 3.8%. Employment set another new record with the UK economy adding another 99,000 workers for a new high of 32.7m people now in some sort of employment, nearly half a million more than a year ago (source: Sky News/ONS) No news as yet from Leeds City Council as regards Otley & Yeadon Ward as we went to press.
